1. Faculty of Law (FOL)

The Faculty of Law at the University of Central Punjab traces its roots to Punjab Law College, established in 1987, and later evolved into a full faculty in 2016. Since its inception, the faculty has been dedicated to shaping future legal professionals by focusing on three core areas: developing critical observation, problem solving and representation skills, instilling ethical values for resolving dilemmas, and nurturing social empathy that enables lawyers to connect with communities. The faculty follows an experiential learning approach, requiring students to complete pro bono service hours as part of their degree, thereby transforming legal knowledge into practical action. With a variety of academic and professional opportunities, the Faculty of Law prepares students to achieve their goals and contribute meaningfully to society.

An integral part of this approach is the Law Clinic Programme, which provides students with practical experience through clinical methods of teaching. The programme serves a dual purpose: delivering pro bono legal services to underprivileged communities and offering students hands on learning opportunities. To support this initiative, the faculty has established a dedicated law clinic office for client counselling, legal research, case preparation, and record keeping, alongside a legal secretary's office for documentation and case management, and a conference room for discussions and strategy building. The law clinic further integrates practice with academics through training sessions on moot courts, mock trials, debates, and legal research writing.

In addition to the Law Clinic, the Peace and Mediation Centre at the Faculty of Law promotes peace studies, focusing on the causes of conflict and the mechanisms of conflict resolution. The centre combines academic courses with practical applications, addressing peace at personal, national, and global levels. It provides students with opportunities for research, training, and collaboration with organizations working for peace and humanity. A key component of the centre is mediation, offering a platform for pro bono services in negotiation, mediation, and arbitration. Together, the law clinic and peace centre reflect the faculty's commitment to holistic legal education that blends theory, practice, and social responsibility.

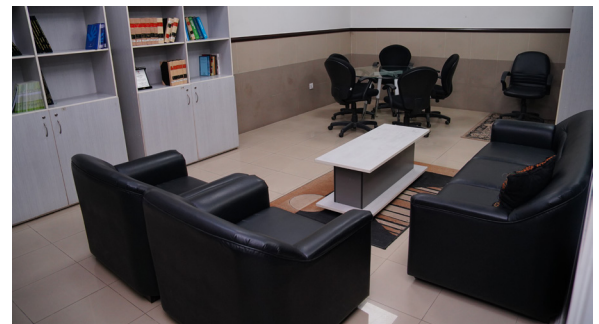

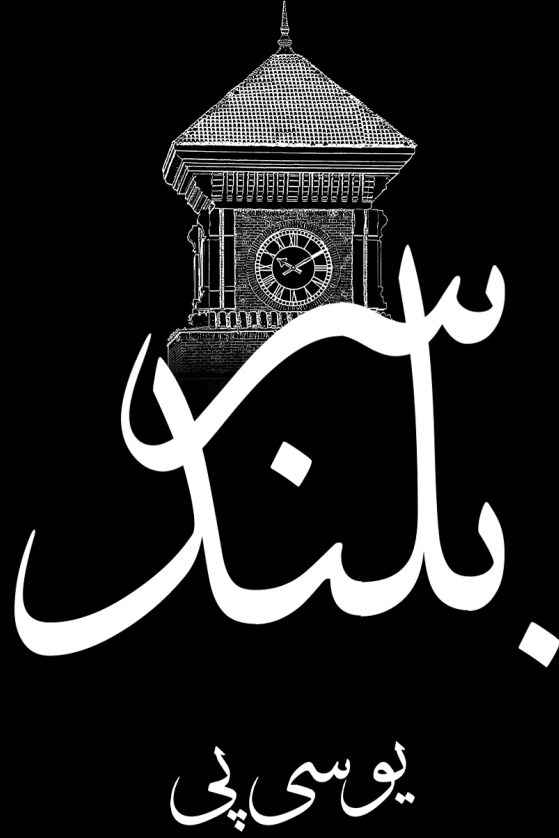
